We have spoken without thinking,



Today's cover art, *The Tower of Blue Horses* by Franz Marc, boldly displays the horses' power and might. In the reading from the letter of James today, we are reminded that our speech is equally powerful and mighty. There is both good news and significant warning here. Horses can be guided with a bridle; how are we guided in our speech? The poet Mary Oliver wrote a poem inspired by this painting, which reads, in part: "Franz Marc died a young man, shrapnel in his brain. / I would rather die than explain to the blue horses / what war is. / They would either faint in horror, or simply / find it impossible to believe. / I do not know how to thank you, Franz Marc. / Maybe our world will grow kinder eventually."

Adult Education with Rev. Dr. Frances Taylor Gench


